


(above) A screenshot from Justis demonstrating a typical document



Primary Case Law

The Law Reports

Published since 1865, when The Incorporated Council of Law Reporting for England & Wales was established, The Law Reports is the most authoritative series of published reports of cases which constitute binding precedent in English law. The database incorporates all earlier divisions of The Law Reports and the four modern ones - the Court of Appeal, Chancery, Family and Queen's Bench Divisions. These reports include the added feature of exact replica PDF files available for printing or downloading.

The Weekly Law Reports

Only cases that develop or clarify a point of law or that set legal precedent are included. Practice Directions, Practice Notes and Practice Statements are also covered. Coverage starts from June 1999 and between thirty and forty cases are added each month.

State Trials

Human Rights

CCH Tax Cases

- CCH British Tax Cases including the Tax Cases (1875 – 1981) and the British Tax Cases (1982 – present)

CCH British Tax Cases is the reproduction of the full text of judgments reported during the tax year in cases heard in the various courts, each with a headnote outlining the facts, the decision and the reasons for the decision.

British VAT Cases is a collection of decisions of the VAT & Duties Tribunals. It deals with appeals arising from decisions of HM Customs & Excise and also matters relating to certain decisions of the Financial Services Authority.

British Tax Cases, British VAT Cases and Special Commissioners' Decisions are fully cross referenced and can be searched together with other Justis subscription titles such as The Law Reports and The Weekly Law Reports.

Inquest Law Reports

The number of cases argued in the High Court involving inquest law has grown considerably since the commencement of the Human Rights Act 1998.

However, cases relevant to the work of Coroner's Courts remain reported in a number of disparate sources, if at all. Inquest Law Reports collects all cases relevant to inquest law readily in one publication. The reports provide the full text of judgments from the High Court, Court of Appeal, House of Lords and relevant judgments from the European Court of Human Rights on Article 2. Each case has a headnote prepared by a team of barristers and solicitors who specialise in inquest law.

Statute Law

The UK Statutes database contains the full text of all Acts of Parliament in England, Wales and Scotland as enacted from 1235 to the present day. UK Statutes is the only statute law database to contain Scottish Acts of Parliament and repealed legislation.

Contents of Justis UK Statutes:

- Acts of Parliament (United Kingdom) 1707 to present
- Acts of Parliament (Scotland) 1999 to present
- Acts of the Northern Ireland Assembly from 2000
- Church Assembly and General Synod Measures 1920 to present

The data is sourced from Ruffhead's edition of Statutes at Large up to 1866 and henceforth from HMSO. We note the effect of legislative amendments since publication as well as add the explanatory notes from the time they were introduced in 1999.

All Acts appear as enacted, with links to amended and amending legislation allowing the user to trace the development of the law. A notable feature of the Justis software is the Cross-ref tab, which provides users with a visual display of the path of legislation, making developments easy to follow. Amendments shown in Cross-ref are taken from the Chronological Table of Statutes 1994 and the Annual Table of Effects for 1995 to 1997. From 1998 onwards the amendments are added by our own editorial team.

UK Statutes can be searched in conjunction with Justis UK Statutory Instruments to find the SIs that are related to the Act of Parliament you are searching for.

HERMES contains the press releases and announcements from most of the major government departments and agencies in England and Scotland. Around 9,500 releases a year are added to HERMES, an average of 40 each working day. The releases include the department of origin, the headline and the full text as issued.

EU Law

Justis CELEX

Coverage: Complete from 1951 to present

Data provider: The Office for Official Publications of the European Communities

Format: Web or CD-ROM

The data in Justis CELEX is provided by the Office of Official Publications of the European Communities (EUR-OP) and is drawn from each of the principal institutions of the European Union: the Commission, the Council, the Parliament and the Court of Justice. Justis CELEX contains the following sectors:

Justis Official Journal C Series

Contains documents from the C Series of the Official Journal of the European Communities, with the full text of proposed legislation (known as COM DOCS) from January 1990, along with written questions and their answers from the European Parliament, notices of new treaties and details of competition law.

OJ Daily

Coverage: Complete from 1998 to present

Data provider: The Office for Official Publications of the European Communities

Format: Web

OJ Daily offers daily updates of all documents published in the Official Journal C and L Series since 1998, including tables, diagrams and maps with links to full text documents in PDF.
